
#### What is the PIT Count?






## Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 Crittenden County




## Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 Cross County




#### Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 Lee County




## Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 Monroe County




## Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 Phillips County




### Homeless Enrollment by Type Data 2023-2024 St. Francis County

#### Key Info/Terms Regarding PIT

- Date of the PIT: 1/24/2024
- Sheltered Homelessness: Adults, Children, and Unaccompanied Children who, on the night of the of the count, are living in shelters.
- **Emergency Shelter:** Any facility with the primary purpose of providing temporary shelter for the homeless in general or for specific populations of the homeless.
- Transitional Housing: Program that provides temporary housing with supportive services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness with the goal of interim stability and support to successfully move to and maintain permanent housing.

- Youth: Persons under age 25.
- Unaccompanied Youth: Any persons under age 25 who are not accompanied by a parent or guardian or any other household member age 25 or older, and who are not a parent presenting with or sleeping in the same place as his/her child(ren).
- Parenting Youth: A youth who identifies as the parent or legal guardian of one or more children who are present with or sleeping in the same place as that youth parent, where there is no person age 25 or older in the household.
- Chronically Homeless: A person who:
  - Is homeless and lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in emergency shelter; and
  - Has been homeless and living or residing in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter continuously for at least 1 year or on at least four separate occasions in the last 3 years where the combined length of time homeless in those occasions is at least 12 months; and
  - Has a disability.
